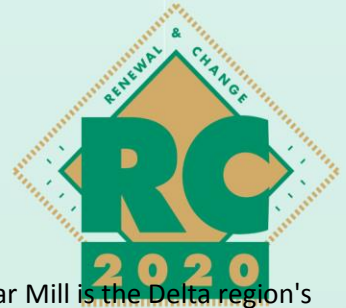

Downtown Sacramento is changing. The City is in the midst of an ambitious regeneration program which will keep the downtown area alive. Formally known as Downtown Commons, referred to by locals as DoCo, the regeneration project will ensure that, among others, the Sacramento Kings remain at the heart of the City.

In addition to its location, Golden 1 Center will be carbon and grid neutral, as well as LEED Gold-certified, which is a rating system that measures the design, construction and operation of high performance green buildings, homes and neighborhoods.

We will enjoy a tour of the construction project and will learn about the regeneration impact.

With the Sacramento River to the east and beautiful vineyards to the west, Old Sugar Mill is the Delta region's most distinct location.

The Old Sugar Mill is home to a unique community of six California wineries and their signature wines: Todd Taylor Wines, Three Wine Company, The Solomon Wine Company, Heringer Estates, Clarksburg Wine Company, and the Carvalho Family Wines. The majority of the vineyards are located in the Clarksburg AVA (American Viticulture Area), where vineyards share the same morning fog and cool breezes from the San Francisco Bay that shape the growing seasons in the vineyards of Napa and Sonoma.

We will enjoy a tour of the Old Sugar Mill and sample the great wine.
